FAMILY FUN AT SUNRIVER

Bicycle Rentals: 33 miles of paved bicycle paths. We rent tandems, suspension and regular mountain bikes, children's bikes, trailers and more. Add to your biking fun by joining the bike tour to Benham Falls. This 2.5 hour, roundtrip bike tour will wind through Ponderosa pines in the scenic Deschutes National Forest.

Paulina Plunge Waterfall Bike Tour: You will begin your tour at one of Oregon's most scenic volcanic jewels, the Newberry Volcanic National Monument. During the length of the trip you will descend over 2500 vertical feet on your mountain bike, which includes four 1.5-mile biking segments to each waterfall stop. While coasting down the smooth dirt forest trails, you will be close to the sparkling waterfalls of Paulina Creek. You will visit 6 pristine waterfalls ranging in height from 10 to 40 feet as well as 2 safe natural waterslides to explore and play in.

Fishing: Sunriver Resort is an Orvis endorsed lodge. If you are after trophy-sized trout this is the place to do it. All trips include gear and licenses. Spin Fishing and Fly Fishing.

Marina: The Sunriver Marina offers canoe, raft and kayak float trips down the scenic calm Deschutes River. We will pick you up down the river and bring you back to the Marina.

Canoeing High in the Cascades: Take an exciting journey deep into the heart of the rugged Cascade Range to paddle the glassy waters of a pristine mountain lake. Explore the fingers of basaltic lava, which spilled over Mt. Bachelor's 9000-foot slopes, spewing steam as it collided with frigid mountain melt-off from the Three Sisters. A swim for the hearty can happen on the shores of the lake!

Nature Center and Observatory: A small museum with displays of live animals, Sunriver's history, botanical garden and hands on exhibits. The newly expanded observatory houses several new telescopes. Experience an evening program or maybe a daytime solar viewing of our closest star: the Sun!

Stables: Your guided adventure begins by crossing over the Deschutes River into National Forest territory. You'll venture to the highest point of Ramsey's Ridge captivating the serenity of the Sunriver Valley. The stables also offer hayrides, 1/2 hour to 8-hour trail rides, pony rides and lessons.

Swimming: Sunriver Resort offers three outdoor swimming pools for pure relaxation and fun. No charge for resort guests.

Tennis: Sunriver's 23 outdoor tennis courts keep players busy or visit our brand new tennis facility at the Sage Springs Club and spa. Take advantage of our very own USPTA Tennis professional.

Whitewater Rafting: You will conquer thrilling rapids and float peaceful calm stretches while exploring the forested beauty of the upper Deschutes River. The highlight of this three-hour trip is the slide down the Big Eddy rapid. Sun Country Tours also offers the "Deschutes All Day," the McKenzie and North Umpqua River trips.

Caving in the Desert: Scattered around the sage-covered High Desert lie ancient caves, buried by the volcanic upheavals in centuries known to past peoples. At the mouth of the cave an introduction to the geology, micro-ecosystems and wildlife will be shared. Trekking down in to the cave, lantern in hand, we will get to the spelunking area. The lava tube is incredible! It's gigantic size and formations are something at which to marvel. Maximum of 14 guests per day.

Trek the Cascades: A super hike for the entire family to discover the Cascade Mountains most beautiful tucked away lakes. These short, level trails will expose you to nature's handiwork – abounding geology, unequalled views of craggy Broken Top Mountain and spectacular glaciers spilling down South Sister's rocky slopes. We'll walk in the home of osprey and otters while filling our senses with the rejuvenating smell of evergreen forests.
